| Alder Grove Primary School           | 60                         | The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. After co-ordination, the last child allocated came from Category 4 living 0.430 miles from the school. There were insufficient places for the remaining 71 children in Category 4 who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.  |
| Aldryngton Primary                   | 45                         | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under oversubscription criteria A to E and 15 under criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 0.538 miles from the school according to the computerised mapping system used by the council's School Admissions Team. There were insufficient places for the remaining 23 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. The local authority will advise an appeals panel that the admission of further children would prejudice future infant class size. |
| All Saints CE (Aided) Primary        | 45*                        | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination. Places in the resource will be allocated by the Special Educational Needs Team. 2 children were offered places at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places.  |
| Bearwood Primary                     | 45                         | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. 1 child was offered a place at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places.  |
| Beechwood Primary                    | 60                         | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination.  |
| Colleton Primary, The                | 45                         | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination.   |
| Coombes CE Primary, The              | 75                         | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination. 22 children were offered places at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places.   |
| Crazies Hill CE Primary              | 15                         | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination.  |
| Earley St Peter's CE (Aided) Primary | 70                         | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination.  |
| Emmbrook Infant                      | 60                         | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E. The last child allocated under criterion E lived 1.274 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 21 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.   |

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| Evedons Primary                     | 60                         | The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. Following co-ordination, offers could be made to all those applicants meeting criteria 1 to 3 and 31 children in criterion 4. The last child offered under criterion 4 lived 1.071 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 28 children (13 in criterion 4 and 15 in criterion 6) and these children have been provisionally placed on the waiting list pending confirmation from the parents that they wish their child to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size. |
| Farley Hill Primary                 | 60                         | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to C plus 52 in criterion D. The last child allocated under criterion D lived 0.772 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 32 children (13 in criterion D, 2 in criterion E and 17 in criterion F) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.   |
| Finchampstead CE Aided Primary      | 17                         | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination.  |
| Floreat – Montague Park Primary     | 60                         | The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination.  |
| Gorse Ride Infant                   | 60                         | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination.   |
| Grazeley Parochial CE Aided Primary | 30                         | The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. Following co-ordination, offers could be made to all those applicants meeting criteria 1- 4 plus 17 in criterion 5. The last child offered under criterion 5 lived 1.147 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 18 children (17 in criterion 5 and 1 in criterion 6) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.                                       |
| Hatch Ride Primary                  | 30                         | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received. The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to D plus 10 in criterion E. The last child allocated under criterion E lived 0.234 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 15 children (11 in criterion E and 4 children not in listed criterion) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.  |
| Hawkedon Primary                    | 90                         | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination.   |
| Hawthorns Primary, The              | 60                         | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination.   |

| Hillside Primary                                | 60                         | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. 5 children were offered places at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places.  |
| Keep Hatch Primary                              | 60                         | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. 1 child was offered a place at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places.  |
| Lambs Lane Primary                              | 30*                        | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to C plus 26 in criterion D. The last child allocated under criterion D lived 0.858 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 24 children (16 in criterion D, 1 in criterion E and 7 children in criterion F) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.  |
| Loddon Primary                                  | 60                         | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination.  |
| Nine Mile Ride Primary                          | 50                         | Applications were ranked and approved by the Trustees of The Circle Trust in accordance with the school's published oversubscription criteria. Following coordination, the school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under oversubscription criteria A to E and 27 under Criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 1.75 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 10 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. The Academy Trust on behalf of the school agreed to take an additional 4 students above the planned admission number of 50. |
| Oaklands Infant                                 | 60                         | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. 1 child was offered a place at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places.  |
| Piggott School (Charvil Piggott Primary School) | 30                         | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received. The last child allocated under criterion G lived 1.806 miles from the school according to the to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 2 children in criterion G who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.  |
| Polehampton CE Infant                           | 60                         | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under oversubscription criteria A to C and 35 under criterion D. The last child allocated under criterion D lived 0.879 miles from the school according to the to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 7 children (1 in criterion D, 3 in criterion E and 3 in criterion F) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.   |
| Radstock Primary                                | 45                         | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. 9 children were offered places at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places.  |

| Rivermead Primary                 | 60                         | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 7 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 0.551 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 10 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.  |
| Robert Piggott CE Infant          | 45                         | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination.  |
| Shinfield Infant & Nursery        | 90                         | Applications were ranked and approved by the Trustees of The Circle Trust in accordance with the school's published oversubscription criteria. Following co-ordination, offers could be made to all those applicants meeting criteria A- E plus 12 in criterion F. The last child offered under criterion F lived 0.804 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 42 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size. |
| Sonning CE Aided Primary          | 30                         | The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received. The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria 1 to 8 plus 5 children in criterion 9. The last child allocated under criterion 9 lived 1.311 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 3 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.  |
| South Lake Primary                | 60                         | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 13 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 0.856 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 9 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.  |
| St Dominic Savio Catholic Primary | 60                         | The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. After co-ordination, the last child allocated came from Category 8 living 0.825 miles from the school. There were insufficient places for the remaining 13 children in Category 8 who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.   |
| St Nicholas CE Primary            | 20                         | The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria 1 to 4 plus 2 children in criterion 5. The last child allocated under criterion 5 lived 2.353 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 5 children (1 in criterion 5 and in 4 in criterion 6) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school.                                       |
| St Sebastian's CE Aided Primary   | 26                         | The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination.   |
| St Teresa's Catholic Primary      | 45                         | The Admissions Committee considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination.   |
| Walter Infant                     | 90                         | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination.  |
| Wescott Infant                    | 56*                        | Applications were ranked and approved by the Trustees of The Circle Trust in accordance with the school's published oversubscription criteria. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination.   |

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| Wheatfield Primary   | 30                         | Wheatfield Primary School commissioned Wokingham Borough Council to rank its applications in accordance with the school's admission policy and the ranked list was checked and ratified by the Academy Trust Board. The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under First Priority to Third Priority plus 17 in Fourth Priority. The last child allocated under Fourth Priority lived 1.034 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 1 child in Fourth Priority who has been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size. |
| Whiteknights Primary | 60                         | The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to 5 plus 20 in criterion 6. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 1.396 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 5 children in criterion 6 who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.  |
| Willow Bank Infant   | 60                         | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination.  |
| Windmill Primary     | 30                         | Windmill Primary School commissioned Wokingham Borough Council to rank its applications in accordance with the school's admission policy and the ranked list was checked and ratified by the Academy Trust Board. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination.  |
| Winnersh Primary     | 60                         | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination. 2 children were offered places at the school where no higher ranked preference could be offered as either the designated area school or the most accessible school with places.  |
| Woodley CE Primary   | 45                         | All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated places at the school following co-ordination.  |

## KEY TO HOW PLACES WERE ALLOCATED IN COMMUNITY AND VOLUNTARY CONTROLLED SCHOOLS

The following oversubscription criteria, in order of priority, were applied when a community or voluntary controlled school received more preferences than places available:

- A 'Looked after' children or children who were 'looked after', but ceased to be so because they were adopted or became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order (previous 'looked-after' children)
- B Families who have exceptional medical or social needs as the grounds for their admission to a particular school
- C Children whose permanent home address is **inside** the schools' designated area and who has a sibling at the school at the time of application; who is expected to be attending the school when the child will enter the school.
- D Children whose permanent home address is in the school's designated area
- E Children whose permanent home address is **outside** the schools' designated area and who has a sibling at the school at the time of application; who is expected to be attending the school when the child will enter the school.
- F Any other children

*For both community and voluntary controlled schools - all children with statements of special educational needs or an Education, Health and Care Plan that named a school in the statement or plan were admitted to the school that was named*

If the school does not have sufficient places for children in any category, places will then be allocated on the basis of the radial distance using the local authority's computerised mapping system and the distance will be measured as a straight line between the Land and Property Gazetteer address points for the respective home address and school.

The Parent's Guide provides further information relating to each of the above oversubscription criteria
